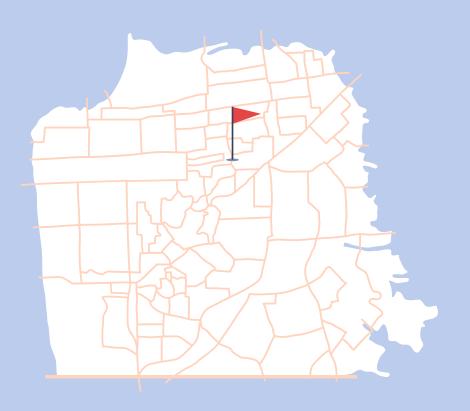

STRING LIGHTS & MAINTENANCE

We are looking to extend string lights down further on Divisadero, to the cross street of O'Farrell. The ambience of the lively Divisadero Street seems to come to an abrupt stop at McAllister, excluding some merchants (predominantly black-owned businesses) from the energy of the rest of the street. Lights have shown to increase safety, foot traffic, and energy in the illuminated areas.



NATURAL BEAUTIFICATION

The addition of planter boxes, trees, hanging plants, etc. would promote the neighborhood's aesthetic for locals and visitors alike. Trees in the street divider are, at current, poorly maintained if improved could add significantly to the community.



MARQUEE & BANNER

Divisadero Street is a San Francisco home base that is not hugely recognized. With marquees or banners on either end of the corridor, a "Welcome to Divisadero" sign would greatly improve the status of the area as a classic SF neighborhood.



BRANDING OF DIVISADERO ST.

We'd like to see some of the Avenue Greenlight funds put toward the branding of Divisadero St. as a landmark location. Divisadero is a core of San Francisco historically, culturally, and regionally. Despite this, Divisadero isn't known as the landmark it is - we'd like to change that. We think ample branding of the street could bring in local foot traffic, tourism, and recognition. In order to achieve this goal, the funds should be spent to hire a PR/Branding person to help consolidate the Divisadero brand and set out an action timeline.



ANNUAL EVENTS

We host events like the neighborhood Art Walk, which we usually fund through member contributions and donations. We'd like to hold some of the Avenue Greenlight funds to create a pocket of money to supplement costs of organizing events and funding supplies.
